Route Outside of Town – Sample of Responses

- Move rail traffic around Springfield and not through it!

- To have Hanson be absolutely independent in it's assessment and not be swayed by the City of Springfield's recommendation of 10th Street.

Corridor Preference East – Sample of Responses

- Relocated 3rd to 10th or 19th Street corridors.

Route Outside of Town - Sample of Responses

- Moving rail lines outside the city would be a wise use of money in the long run.
- If they can't be moved out of the city, they need to be made compatible with the surrounding neighborhoods.

Safety – Sample of Responses

- Safety/sound at grade crossings, if in a quiet zone. Warning lights should be installed in order to caution drivers of approaching trains, before the stop signal.
- Why is there no consideration of safety based on what trains transport vs. location out of town.
