## **Station Guide**

## Welcome!

Thank you for attending tonight's Open House. The following guide is an overview of the information presented at each station. Project team members are available at every station to answer your questions.

**Station #1 - Project Information:** This station provides the project purpose, benefits, funding, and remaining grade separations, as well as results from the Environmental Impact Statement. You can also find projected train traffic information, a map of existing rail corridors, and the approved alternative for rail consolidation.

**Station #2 - Tenth Street Corridor:** At this station you can view an aerial mosaic of the Tenth Street corridor.

**Station #3 - Carpenter Street Underpass:** Learn more about the Carpenter Street Underpass (Usable Segment I) that was completed in August of 2016. View photos of the construction and final design.

**Station #4 - Archaeological Site:** Here you will find information about the Carpenter Street Archaeological Site testing and findings, as well as the Section 106 Consulting Parties process led by the Federal Railroad Administration.

**Station #5 - Ash and Laurel Street Underpasses:** At this station you can learn more about the current construction segment at the Ash and Laurel Street Underpasses (Usable Segment II). Information includes funding, a project schedule, and a map of displacements.

**Station #6 - Madison and Jefferson Street Underpasses:** At this station you can learn more about the Madison and Jefferson Street Underpasses (Usable Segment III). Information includes funding, a project schedule, and a map of displacements.

**Station #7 - Princeton to Stanford:** At this station you can learn more about the segment from Princeton to Stanford (Usable Segment IV). Information includes an aerial map, funding, and a project schedule.

**Station #8 - Land Acquisition:** This station provides information on the land acquisition process, as well as residential and commercial relocation benefits.

**Station #9 - Community Outreach:** Here you can learn more about minority contracting and LLCC training, as well as pick-up fact sheets about the project.

**Station #10 - Grow Our Own:** Visit this station for more information on the Grow Our Own minority participation project.
